Dear Mr. Frank:

Thank you for your letter dated February 3, 2010 regarding the permissibility of a disabled beneficiary 65 years of age and older transferring assets into a First Maryland Disability Trust (a pooled trust) sub-account without penalty. I have reviewed this issue and agree that there is no age limitation imposed by existing federal or state law on who may transfer assets into a pooled trust sub-account. Accordingly, a disabled beneficiary 65 years of age and older may transfer assets into an approved pooled trust sub-account without penalty.

This general interpretive statement of law, however, does not address the permissibility of transferring assets from a special needs trust to a pooled trust, nor does it address the legitimacy under state law of any specific special needs trust or pooled trust. All such issues must first be reviewed and approved on a case-by-case basis by the Office of the Attorney General for the assets to be excluded from the beneficiary's resources for Medical Assistance eligibility determination purposes.
